Topic: Young Children Are Highly Capable Of Scientific Thinking

“We know that young children are highly capable of scientific thinking, and, in fact, science is the ideal domain for them—it’s what children are most interested in. They are trying to make sense of and understand how their world works,” says Dr. Daryl B. Greenfield. Dr. Greenfield will share his research on using science education as the foundational focus of improving the school readiness of infants, toddlers, and preschoolers.

Dr. Daryl B. Greenfield’s work is positioned at the interface of research, policy and practice at the international, national, state and local level broadly focused on school readiness with at- risk and dual language learners, with a more specific focus on early science education. He served as a member of the Expert Panel for the Canadian Institutes of Health Research’s Networks of Centers of Excellence in Early Childhood Development and Society; an Advisor for the Pan American Health Organization; a technical adviser for early science for each of the three funded statewide KEA Consortia (led by Maryland, North Carolina, and Texas) to create greater continuity between early childhood and the early elementary grades; and an adviser to the Office of Head Start for early science for the new Head Start Early Learning Outcomes Framework (Birth to Five). He is currently a Principal Investigator on federally (National Science Foundation, Institute of Education Science, Administration for Children and Families) and privately (United Way, Buffett Early Childhood Fund, Stranahan Foundation) funded research grants to develop and evaluate early childhood STEM (science technology, engineering and mathematics) programs and develop and evaluate touch screen computer adaptive science assessments, for both English and Spanish speaking young children. He currently serves as an advisor on multiple national, state, and local panels, advisory boards, and work groups for issues related to research, policy and practice in early STEM including the Research to Practice Advisory Group for the Head Start National Center on Early Child Development, Teaching and Learning. He is one of the authors of a 2017 policy brief, “Early STEM Matters.” He was the invited speaker on early science at the 2016 White House summit on STEM in early childhood. He was the 2017 Hansen Endowed Early Childhood Lecturer at Iowa State University on his work in early childhood science and was the keynote speaker at the Buffett Early Childhood Institute Conference on “Children as Scientists: Scientific Inquiry for Every Child.” In Florida he has co-chaired the Florida Head Start Research Committee, participated as a national expert for the Florida Office of Early Learning to create Florida’s Early Learning Standards, and served for three years as one of three technical advisers for the Florida Office of Early Learning. He has given talks on his early science work all over the world.

Dr. Pamela C. Phelps has over 50 years' experience working with young children and their families. For nine years she taught kindergarten and first grade in the public schools of Wakulla and Leon Counties in the state of Florida. For the past forty-nine years, she has been the Owner/Director of the Creative Pre-School, providing care for children, ages two months through Kindergarten. Creative has been chosen as a national and state model for the inclusion of young children with disabilities; continuously nationally accredited since 1989; and "A Gold Seal" program in the state of Florida. It is also the home of The Creative Pre-School Model Program Curriculum: Beyond Centers and Circle Time®. Dr. Phelps

is the Vice-President of The Creative Center for Childhood Research and Training, a non-profit corporation, providing training and program consultation for adults working with young children. CCCRT conducts and supports research, makes presentations to professional and non-professional groups on a variety of subjects concerning young children and their families, and is a major sponsor of the One Goal: Building The Future Together "Putting Families and Children First" Conference. She is an international consultant on early childhood education to the Republic of Indonesia and has conducted multiple national symposiums and workshops in that country and the Caribbean. Dr. Phelps is active in local, state, and national professional organizations. She works as an advocate for young children and their families on both the state and national levels. Dr. Phelps is a past chair of the State of Florida's Coordinating Council for Early Childhood Services appointed by the Commissioner of Education for the State of Florida and a past member of The Florida Interagency Council for Infants and Toddlers. She has published articles in professional early childhood and special education journals; directed research in early childhood settings; and regularly conducts workshops for educators and parents on play and play environments, behavior management, and numerous other topics related to young children. Dr. Phelps has received numerous awards and recognitions.
